Why do we exercise?

- Improving specific emergency operations or procedures
- Correcting deficiencies and problems
- Development and implementation of a new plan
- Training
- Changes in leadership
- "Because we HAVE to"



Homeland Security Exercise and Evaluation Program (HSEEP)

The (HSEEP) doctrine consists of fundamental principles that frame a common approach to exercises. Applying these principles to both the management of an exercise program and the execution of individual exercises is critical to the effective examination of capabilities.



Homeland Security Exercise and Evaluation Program (HSEEP)

- Capability-based
- Objective driven
- Progressive planning approach (Building Block Approach)
- Whole community integration
- Informed by risk
- Common methodology
- Multi-Year Training & Exercise Plan


