

Emergency Management Planning Standards, Regulations, and Guidelines

The following agencies and organizations have set forth requirements/expectations, or standards related to emergency management (EM) plans:

Health Resource and Services Administration (HRSA)

The emergency management expectations for health centers include:

- Emergency management planning—health centers should be engaged in an ongoing, continuous process to ensure that emergency management plans (EMP) are appropriate.
- Linkages and collaborations—health centers should maximize their linkages and collaborations.
- **Communications and information sharing**—health centers should have policies and procedures for communicating and sharing information with internal and external stakeholders.
- Maintaining financial and operational stability—health centers' business plans should address financial viability in the event of an emergency.

New York State Department of Health (NYS DOH)

Title 10 Section 702.7 - Emergency and disaster preparedness

"Medical facilities shall have an acceptable written plan, rehearsed and updated at least twice a year, with procedures to be followed for the proper care of patients and employees, including the reception and treatment of mass casualty victims, in the event of an internal or external emergency or disaster arising from the interruption of normal services resulting from earthquake, tornado, flood, bomb threat, strike, interruption of utility services and similar occurrences. All employees are to be trained in all aspects of preparedness for any interruption of services and for any disaster."

The Joint Commission

Ambulatory Care Standards (Effective July 1, 2015)-

EM.01.01.01: The organization engages in planning activities prior to developing its Emergency Management Plan.

EM.02.01.01: The organization has an Emergency Management Plan.

EM.03.01.01: The organization evaluates the effectiveness of its Emergency Management Plan.

Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) Proposed Rule

"This rule proposes emergency preparedness requirements for Medicare and Medicaid participating providers and suppliers to ensure that they adequately plan for both natural and man-made disasters and coordinate with Federal, State, tribal, regional, and local emergency preparedness systems. This rule would ensure providers and suppliers are adequately prepared to meet the needs of patients, residents, clients, and participants during disasters and emergency situations."
